As the path starts to descend you cross a stream and then come to a clear crossroads with cairns and right of way signs. Head right, downhill, to meet the path running below Burbage Edge and another right of way sign.

Turn left onto this path for a few yards to a further right of way sign at which point turn right, heading downhill, to the corner of the wood you can see below on the valley floor.

Cross Burbage Brook by the stone bridge and follow the clear path uphill until you meet the path joining Carl Wark (L) and Higger Tor (R).

To visit Carl Wark divert left and then reverse your steps to follow the pitched path up to Higger Tor.

Where the path splits close to the top of Higger Tor keep left to pick the easiest route/scramble

through the rocks. There is nothing difficult or exposed about this section just be prepared to use knees and hands to get yourself over one or two larger and awkward rocks. Young children will, of course, have hours of fun scrambling up and down this section.

Once on the top of Higger Tor head north, (keep parallel to Burbage Rocks) to pick up the path close to the edge. When this path splits keep right to head downhill and follow the path to Fiddler's Elbow.

The path climbs over Fiddler's Elbow to eventually reach the gate into the car park where, if you're lucky, an ice-cream van may be waiting for you.
