




Helen explains, "fully qualified driving instructors must take regular tests known as check tests, introduced to maintain the quality of tuition. A senior examiner watches the driving instructor perform a lesson with a real pupil and instructors are then graded on their ability"

A Grade 4 instructor is classed as 'competent', Grade 5 means 'good' and Grade 6 'of a very high standard'. There are approximately 27,000 instructors on the Register of Advanced Driving Instructors - less than 10% of these are Grade 6. Helen Edwards is one of these elite few - so rest assured you will be learning with one of the best.

Charlotte Tansley from Horsley (pictured right) passed her test first time with HLE Driving School after just seven months of tuition.
