Memorial Service

Christina Lamb died on 5th August 2008 in hospital near her home in Montpellier on the French Mediterranean coast, after a long fight against emphysema.

A Memorial Service will be held at United Reform Church, Little Eaton (formerly Congregational Chapel) Sunday, 2nd November 2008 At 2.30 pm



She will be remembered by many as Chris Fox of Brook Cottages, Little Eaton, where she attended the primary school before going on to Strutts Grammar school in Belper. After service as an airborne radar mechanic with the WAAF she participated actively in local life, playing hockey for Belper Ladies, and as secretary of WI. Christina married Geoffrey in St Peter's Church, Little Eaton in 1951. They moved to Horsley Woodhouse in 1959.

In 1965 they moved, and eventually set up in business as engineering consultants, working in many countries of Asia and Africa, before finally settling down in retirement in the south of France.

Upon her death in early August it became immediately clear that relatives and friends could not find flights or train reservations from UK to the south of France; a civil funeral was held locally and the decision made to hold a Memorial Service in Little Eaton at the church which Christina had supported so actively, even during all her years of absence.
